


Empower your students to make a real and lasting impact for a local community in Bali, Vietnam, Thailand or Cambodia

This heartfelt community project is a collaboration between Discova and the villagers of Manggis, born out of a dire agricultural dilemma that threatened the villagers' livelihoods and welfare during the pandemic.

Students will learn how local farmers moved away from traditional farming practices to more sustainable and organic methods, simultaneously generating additional income in the process.

They will also get hands-on farming experience and unique insight into the life of the Balinese farmer, and find out how the project supported women enterprise and equity in the village.

In 2007, we began working with communities in the Mai Chau district of northern Vietnam to improve infrastructure, education, water supply for agriculture, and build up community-led tourism in the area.

Over the years, four kilometres of road have been built, five dams reinforced or constructed, a Happy Library opened where students can borrow and read books in comfort, and a cattle bank created for local farmers. Thanks to the financial support of many of our commercial partners, and the hands-on project work and donations made by visiting educational groups, all of this and more was made possible.

However, with the onset of the pandemic and the halting of educational group visits, many projects came to a standstill. The villagers desperately need the financial support from visiting education groups to continue developing their local community.

We have been working with the Om Goi community in Chiang Mai province in northern Thailand for over 25 years. Made up of largely ethnic minority families, this is one of the most impoverished regions in Thailand.

During our 25-year relationship with the community, we have forged a strong bond that has led to the development of successful community-led tourism initiatives. This has allowed us to raise money for vital infrastructure projects – decided upon directly with the communities – through education group contributions.

With the pandemic, this revenue dried up and critical projects were put on hold. In spite of this, Discova managed to raise enough funds to build a water filtration system through our Walk for Water campaign. However, many projects remain on hold. Educational programs such as this one bring vital funding to villages that need it most for survival.

The Trei Nhoar commune in Siem Reap province consists of 10 villages that struggle with access to clean water, safe sanitation, quality education and economic stability. While there is enough water available during the rainy season, it is not safe for drinking (yet villagers have no choice but to). The problem is exacerbated during Cambodia's dry season, when there is not enough water for the whole community.

Your groups will be part of a long-term development plan for the community. Starting with the construction of necessary toilets and water filtration systems, the project will carry forward into elevating the village's economic position.

Beyond infrastructural project support, your students will also empower the community economically. The local villagers have been trained by our in-destination team to become service providers, so that they can offer engaging local cultural activities at the project site.


